### The Lowry Academy 'ASK LOWRY' communication procedure

We are working to improve our communication with parents and carers. We have taken feedback from families and have been working behind the scenes to offer another way in which you can easily contact us.

We have set up what we are calling 'Ask Lowry'. This is a tool to contact school for all requests and enquiries including passing a message to a member of staff, requesting a member of staff to call you back, requesting a meeting, uniform queries, plus all general queries and enquiries.

To contact us with your request/enquiry you can do this by either:

- 1. Visit the contact page on our school website www. And complete the online 'Ask Lowry' form.
- 2. E-mail us on ask.lowry@lowryacademy.org.uk

#### A few points to remember:

- The school working day is 0800 1600 but you can send an enquiry at any time of the day.
- You will receive a response during the school working day during school term time.
- Any enquiries/requests received during school holiday time will be responded to on the first day back to school.
- Please use the Ask Lowry facility and we ask that parents avoid telephoning the main office unless for except in an urgent situation.

#### Benefits of using Ask Lowry

- Your enquiry whether by e-mail or website form will be logged.
- You will sent an acknowledgement, telling you we have received your email and giving you a timescale to expect a response by.
- Your enquiry will be sent to the relevant person in school with a deadline to respond by and you will receive a response within the timeframe given.

Dear Parents,

If you have a child aged 2 or 3 years old you should receive a letter in September or October from your GP inviting your child for a free nasal influenza vaccination. We would encourage you to ensure your child receives this protective vaccine; this will help to prevent the spread of influenza in children and also in friends and relatives who may be at risk of complications from influenza. It will also prevent time spent away from work looking after a sick child, if applicable.

The nasal spray influenza vaccine is also available for all school aged children and offered routinely to all children in school. The vaccine is given as a single dose of nasal spray squirted up each nostril. **This is not a needle** (a big advantage for children), the nasal spray works even better than the injected influenza vaccine. The vaccine is very safe with few side effects and has been used for a number of years in the UK.

It's quick and painless and will mean your child is less likely to become ill, resulting in less time away from school, if they come into contact with the influenza virus. Its brand name is <u>Fluenz</u>.

Children are good at spreading influenza, because they tend to sneeze everywhere and don't use tissues properly or wash their hands. Vaccinating them may also protect others that are vulnerable to influenza such as babies, older people, pregnant women and people with serious long-term illnesses. A common complication of influenza can be bronchitis; occasionally this can become serious and develop into <u>pneumonia</u> and even cause death.

Questions and answers are on the back of this letter that will hopefully answer any queries you may have. If you have any further questions, please do not hesitate to contact your GP, school nurse or Health Visitor.

If anyone you know falls into the at-risk groups encourage them to have the influenza vaccine to prevent them becoming ill.

#### What is Influenza (flu)?

Flu is caused by a virus and cannot be treated with antibiotics. The most common symptoms of flu are fever, chills, headache, aches and pains in the joints and muscles, and extreme tiredness. Healthy individuals usually recover within 2 to 7 days but for some the disease can lead to hospitalisation, permanent disability or even death.

#### Can I avoid flu?

The best way to avoid catching and spreading flu is by having the vaccination before the flu season starts!

#### If I get flu how do I reduce the risk of spreading it to someone else?

To prevent spread: cover the mouth and nose with a tissue when you sneeze or cough, dispose of the tissues and then wash your hands. "Catch it, Bin it, Kill it."

#### Who should have the flu vaccination?

Even if you feel healthy you should have the free flu vaccination if you are:

- All health and social care workers
- All carers- both paid/unpaid
- age 6 months to 65 years if you have an underlying health condition
- a household contact of an immuno-compromised person
- living in a residential or nursing home
- pregnant women
- 2 and 3 year old (nasal) via GP
- All school aged children (nasal) via schools programme

#### How do I get the flu vaccine?

The vaccines should be given during October or early November. If you fit the above criteria speak to your GP or Practice Nurse to book a vaccination appointment and get the best possible protection.

#### How effective is the flu vaccine?

The annual flu vaccination will protect you against flu this coming winter. No vaccine is 100% effective; however, people who have had the flu vaccine are less likely to get flu. If you do get flu despite having the vaccine, it will probably be milder than if you haven't been vaccinated.

#### Flu vaccines side effects - what are they?

The flu vaccine does not cause flu. However, you may experience some mild side effects after having the vaccine, such as a slight temperature and cold-like symptoms for a couple of days afterwards. The flu vaccine only protects against flu, but not other illnesses caused by other viruses such as the common cold.

#### Can the flu vaccine be given to my child at the same time as other vaccines?

Yes. The flu vaccine can be given at the same time as all routine childhood vaccines. The vaccination can go ahead if your child has a minor illness such as a cold but may be delayed if your child has an illness that causes a fever.

#### **Mock Timetable**

#### MFL Madrid Trip – February 2024

We are excited to be proposing a school tour to Madrid to support our curriculum plans for Spanish students and enhance learning experiences within the school.

Here are the key details about the planned trip:

- 3 days (2 nights) in Madrid
- Departs on Monday 19<sup>th</sup> February 2024 (Precise details TBC)
- Returns on Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> February 2024 (Precise details TBC)
- The cost is £635 per pupil
- This price includes:
  - Flights to and from Madrid
  - One item of hold luggage
  - Coach travel whilst in Madrid
  - Bed & Breakfast Accommodation in a central Madrid Hotel
  - Activities as detailed below.
  - Transport to and from Manchester Airport & Airport transfers in Madrid.
  - Travel Insurance

We have 9 places remaining and would like to offer these to our Year 10 students. Places will be allocated on a first come, first served basis upon return of the expression of interest consent slip below. These should be given directly to Miss Jones in the MFL department by Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> November. We will contact you to confirm that your child has successfully been allocated a place and with further details about payment. The initial deposit of £300 would be required by 9<sup>th</sup> October or before.

The itinerary for the trip will include; a guided visit to Las Ventas Bullring and Museum, a visit to El Escorial Monastery, The Valley of the Fallen, San Miguel Market and the famous Prada Museum. The trip will also include a 2 Hour Language Lesson at Lingua and a Tapas meal at La Catedral restaurant in central Madrid.

In addition to the tour cost, we recommend that your child has adequate spending money for the trip and enough to cover both lunch and an evening meal for 3 days (approximately £5 per meal, per day). They will also require a current and valid passport with at least 6 months remaining from the departure date.

The initial payment of £300 is due by Monday 13<sup>th</sup> November followed by a final payment of £335 by 10<sup>th</sup> January 2024. Interim payments can be made between the dates outlined above. All payments should be made directly via Parent Pay <u>The Lowry Academy > Parents > ParentPay</u>. This will be confirmed in writing for you with full instructions regarding payment once places have been allocated.

The trip is being booked through European Study Tours who work closely with us during the whole tour planning process to ensure that your child will get the very best learning experience whilst away.
