Dear Parents/Guardians,

As part of our ongoing commitment to improving the culture at the Lowry Academy, we are introducing a new addition to our strategy, which focuses on delivering an excellent experience for students as they move around the Academy between lessons and during social times. Occasionally, students blur the lines between what is accepted and what isn't. Although this is almost always playful, we want to avoid these rare occasions and make it easy for our students to understand how to behave respectfully and maturely at all times, so we will introduce the 'Hands-Off' initiative.

Key Points of the "Hands-Off" strategy:

1. No Physical Contact:

The cornerstone of this initiative is to ensure students adhere to clear boundaries and expectations regarding personal space and respectful conduct around the Academy. No student should feel it is ok for another student to touch them in any way.

2. Behaviour Policy Implementation:

Students will be reminded about the 'Hands-Off' initiative; however, failure to adhere to the 'Hands-Off' initiative could lead to consequences in line with our behaviour policy.

Creating a respectful learning environment requires communication between the Academy and families. Therefore, we appreciate your future cooperation in implementing and upholding the "Hands-Off" strategy.

Dear Parent / Carer

School based Vaccination Programme – The Lowry Academy - Year 9 Students only

<u>3-in-1 Teenage Booster (DTP) and Meningitis ACWY</u> are usually offered to children in Yr 9 approx. Age 13-14. The teenage booster, also known as the 3-in-1 or the Td/IPV vaccine, is given to boost protection against 3 separate diseases: Diphtheria, Tetanus and Polio. The MenACWY vaccine protects against 4 strains of the meningococcal bacteria – A, C, W and Y – which cause meningitis and blood poisoning (septicaemia).

The 0-19 Immunisations team alongside the school Nurses are working in partnership with your child's school to deliver these high school age vaccinations. These vaccinations are not routinely offered at GP practices. All Immunisations are extremely important and ensure that your child is protected later in life, the DTP and MenACWY vaccinations are given alognside each other and will be offered to your child, in school by nurses.

The school Nurses are now using an electronic platform for consenting and information delivery, which is a faster, more efficient and a safer way to deliver your child's health information back to the team.

STEP 1: Please either register for an account if this is your first time using the Thomson parent portal or login if you have already created an account. If this is your first time registering, you will receive an email to confirm your account and set a password.

STEP2: Once you login you can read the information on this year's DTP and MenACWY vaccination campaign and submit the form so that you can receive your electronic results letters. You will have the opportunity to opt out of the vaccination program, if you do not complete a form telling us YES or NO, we will not be able to vaccinate and protect your child.

The electronic consent form allows you to refuse these vaccinations for your child however, if you are thinking of taking this step please talk to your GP or ask to speak to your school nurse first, it is very important that you take this opportunity to protect your child against these very serious diseases.

It is vital the consent form is completed as soon as possible, or on receiving this link, as we will be visiting your child's school during this term. The Lowry Academy 'ASK LOWRY' communication procedure

We are working to improve our communication with parents and carers. We have taken feedback from families and have been working behind the scenes to offer another way in which you can easily contact us.

We have set up what we are calling 'Ask Lowry'. This is a tool to contact school for all requests and enquiries including passing a message to a member of staff, requesting a member of staff to call you back, requesting a meeting, uniform queries, plus all general queries and enquiries.

To contact us with your request/enquiry you can do this by either:

- 1. Visit the contact page on our school website www.lowryacademy.org.uk/contact-us/ask-lowry and complete the online 'Ask Lowry' form.
- 2. E-mail us on <u>ask.lowry@lowryacademy.org.uk</u>

A few points to remember:

- The school working day is 0800 1600 but you can send an enquiry at any time of the day.
- You will receive a response during the school working day during school term time.
- Any enquiries/requests received during school holiday time will be responded to on the first day back to school.
- Please use the Ask Lowry facility and we ask that parents avoid telephoning the main office unless in an urgent situation.

Benefits of using Ask Lowry

- Your enquiry whether by e-mail or website form will be logged.
- You will be sent an acknowledgement, telling you we have received your email and giving you a timescale to expect a response by.
- Your enquiry will be sent to the relevant person in school with a deadline to respond by and you will receive a response within the timeframe given.
