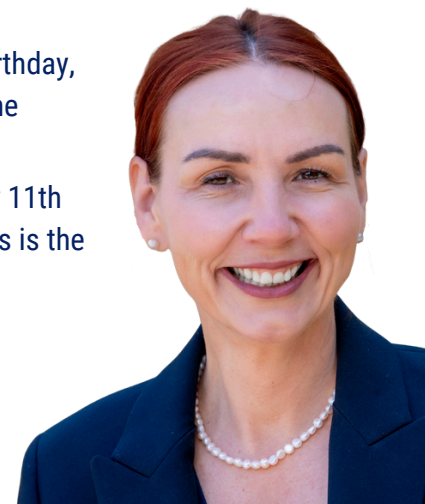
Looking Ahead

Quality of Education

Curriculum Spotlight – Maths



Studying Maths is important because it teaches us how to think clearly, solve problems creatively, and see patterns in the world around us. Mathematics is more than numbers. It's a language of logic and discovery that builds confidence in reasoning and decision making. Whether designing technology, managing finances, or understanding nature, Maths empowers us to turn curiosity into understanding and challenges into opportunities. We teach a broad curriculum so that all students have the opportunity to successfully build on their skills in whatever path they take after GCSEs.

What Students are learning this half term and why it's Important



Year 7: Calculating with and manipulating fractions, polygons.

Year 8: Presenting and interpreting data, averages and spread.

Year 9: Representing and solving inequalities, sequences and an introduction to Pythagoras Theorem.

Year 10: Foundation classes are looking at recapping and extending their knowledge on Pythagoras' Theorem as well as scale diagrams and bearings. Higher classes are learning how to manipulate and calculate with surds, as well as an introduction to right-angle trigonometry.

Year 11: Year 11 classes are in their final preparations for their summer examinations. A number of students are also engaging in extra revision sessions we have organised. Paper 1 is on 14th May. They have worked so hard, we are very proud of them and wish them all the luck as they start their GCSEs.

Having an understanding of fractions allows students to interpret the world around them, from dealing with money to dealing with shape. Polygon study has links to design and construction.

Presenting and interpreting data is important for students to understand any information that they are exposed to. From understanding business analytics to being able to present ideas and support ideas with statistics.

Working with sequences builds skills with pattern spotting, whilst Pythagoras Theorem has links to design, construction, and any professional or life skill working with angles and shape. Similar links and skills are made with trigonometry, whilst working with surds allows students to explore manipulating numbers to be represented

How you can support at home



Ensure your child completes their Sparx homework on time every week. Sparx algorithm gets to know each student and adapts their tasks to make them bespoke and work on the topics they have knowledge gaps in. Homework is released to students every Friday at 4pm and is due Thursday 8am (Y10) or Friday 4pm (all other year groups). Y11 homework is based around revision tasks set by individual teachers.

Talk to your child about the importance of Maths to access the next steps after finishing school.
The best way to improve in Maths is to do more Maths!

Fun Maths Challenge



Ask your child:

- Yr 7: What is a polygon? A 2D shape where all sides are straight lines
- Yr 8: What are the three different averages called? Median, Mode, Mean
- Yr 9: What is the formula for Pythagoras Theorem ?
- Yr 10(F): What is the longest side in a right-angle triangle called? Hypotenuse
- Yr 10(H): What does simplify to?

RE: Planned Government Increase in Free School Meal Allocation – September 2026

We are writing to inform you of an important update from the Department for Education regarding free school meals. The government announced in June 2025 that, starting from September 2026, there will be an increase in the number of students eligible to receive free school meals as part of a national initiative to support families and ensure all children have access to a nutritious meal each school day.

In preparation for this change, families who are currently in receipt of Universal Credit may be eligible to apply for free school meals ahead of the expanded provision. While the official rollout will begin in September 2026, we strongly encourage eligible families to apply during the upcoming academic year (2025–2026) to ensure a smooth transition and timely support.

If your child is already in receipt of free school meals, then you do not need to do anything as this will continue as long as you are still eligible under the current free school meal criteria of earning below £7,400 per annum.
