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Updates to Attendance Reporting and Communication

Dear Parents and Carers,

We are making some improvements to how attendance is reported and how we communicate with you regarding your child's attendance.

Reporting Absences - Now Faster and More Efficient

You will still report your child's absence by phone. However, to help our administrative team process these reports more efficiently, we are now using a system that:

- Identifies the caller based on the phone number we have on record;
- Automatically transcribes voicemail messages for quicker processing.

To ensure this works smoothly, please **use the phone number we have on file** when calling. When leaving a message, simply state:

- Your child's full name;
- The reason for their absence.

If you need to speak to the attendance team for other reasons (e.g. returning a call, submitting medical evidence), there will still be an option to do so. However, **straightforward absence reporting should be done via the automated system**.

Communication from Us - 'A Star Attendance'

All formal attendance communications are sent via a system called 'A Star Attendance'. Please check your junk or spam email folders to ensure you are receiving these messages, especially if your child is currently being monitored for attendance.

We appreciate your support in helping us streamline these processes and ensure timely communication.

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Mastery Sessions

Dear Parents and Carers,

From this week, Students in Years 7-9 have been given knowledge organisers to use in preparation for Mastery sessions, which will launch in Half Term 2. Mastery sessions will take place weekly during form time in the Sports Hall. Students will be given a page of their knowledge organiser the week before to self-quiz at home using the 'Look, Cover, Write, Check' method.

To support your child at home, please ensure they complete their self-quizzing weekly using the correct 'Look, Cover, Write, Check' method, which is as follows:

Look- Students read the information assigned to them from one page of their knowledge organiser

Cover – Students will cover up the page of their knowledge organiser which contains the relevant information.

Write - Students answer a set of assigned questions, without looking at the information provided.

Check – Students go back to the original page of information and check how many answers they have answered correctly and make changes to those that were incorrect.

Form tutors will check this self-quizzing during form time to ensure students have completed it, and then a Mastery quiz will take place in the Sports Hall based on the self-quizzing students have done. If students commit to self-quizzing at home each week and participating fully in the Mastery sessions, it will have an impact on their school performance. The Educational Endowment Fund did some research into the benefits of student self-quizzing, and they found it can have up to a +0.87 impact on student outcomes, and those who regularly commit to self-quizzing at home perform 30% better on assessments than those who don't.

From **W/B 10th November**, Knowledge Organisers will become a compulsory part of school equipment for Year 7-9 students, and any students who do not bring their knowledge organiser on the Mastery Check Day, and their scheduled Mastery Day, will receive a Lowry Line. Any student that receives 2 Lowry Lines each week will receive an after-school detention that week.

We would like to thank you for your continued support in driving forward achievement at the Lowry Academy.

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Salford Digital Heroes Competition

Dear Parents and Carers,

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Curriculum Spotlight - English

At The Lowry Academy the purpose of our English curriculum is to provide pupils with both the skills and the knowledge to access and interact successfully with the world around them. Taking our lead from the National Curriculum's overall aims, we focus on reading (for pleasure, understanding and fluency), the use and understanding of vocabulary and the ability to write clearly and with real purpose. A high-quality English education allows students to become confident in expressing themselves as speakers, writers and interpreters of our information dense world. Ultimately, the success of our English curriculum can be measured by its continued relevance in relation to the constantly shifting times in which we live. Whether crafting an argument, interpreting a poem, or exploring a character's motivations, English equips students with skills that are vital for success in education, employment, and everyday life. We teach a rich and varied curriculum to ensure all students can confidently access and enjoy the subject, whatever path they choose after GCSEs.

What students are learning this half term



- Year 7: Descriptive writing and Joan Aiken's The Wolves of Willoughby Chase
- Year 8: Descriptive gothic writing and Bram Stoker's Dracula
- Year 9: Descriptive writing and Arthur Miller's The Crucible
- Year 10: English Language Approaching and analysing language for Language Paper Two; English Literature – Priestley's An Inspector Calls
- Year 11: English Language Revising approaches to Language Paper Two; English Literature – Revising Power and Conflict Poetry and Priestley's An Inspector Calls

Why this is important



Studying these texts and skills allows students to explore language in a meaningful way, developing their ability to write creatively and analytically. Descriptive writing encourages imagination and precision, while literature introduces students to powerful themes such as identity, justice, and morality. Analysing texts like Dracula, The Crucible, and An Inspector Calls helps students understand how writers use language to influence readers and reflect society. These skills are transferable across subjects and into adult life, supporting everything from job applications to public speaking. English also builds resilience and confidence, encouraging students to form and express their own opinions with clarity and purpose.

How you can Support at Home



- Encourage your child to read regularly fiction, non-fiction, newspapers, or articles anything that builds vocabulary and comprehension.
- Discuss the texts they are studying and ask questions about characters, themes, and language choices.
- Support your child in completing any homework or revision tasks, especially for GCSE preparation.
- Remind them that writing improves with practice the more they write, the more confident they will become.


Education With Character
