Curriculum Spotlight – Geography

The aim of the Geography curriculum is to ensure that students can make sense of the world around them by understanding how the Earth has been shaped by human and physical processes, and how such processes interact, and how human beings have impacted the world in which we live. It also develops transferable skills useful in careers such as urban planning, environmental science, travel and tourism, and international relations.

What students are learning this half term



Year 7 – River Landscapes

Year 8 – Coastal Landscapes

Year 9 – Ecosystems

Year 10 – Changing Economic World

Year 11 – Urban Issues and Challenges

45 students in Year 9 will be visiting White Scar Caves this half term, exploring and learning about the longest show cave in England!

Why is this important?



Each topic studied in the curriculum will provide pupils with the knowledge to be able to think like geographers, empowering them to critically engage with current and future geographical debates beyond the classroom. We also aim to provide students with a sense of their own place within their world, with an awareness of Little Hulton locally, regionally, nationally and globally.

How you can Support at Home



- Ensure your child completes their Geography homework – Homework is set once a fortnight on Microsoft Teams (KS3) and practice exam questions (KS4). This is based on knowledge studied in current learning or previous learning. It is vital this is done to ensure students remember core information to be successful in assessments.
- Get them to revise the key information using their knowledge organisers and the 'Look, Cover, Write, Check' technique.
- Encourage curiosity about the world – look at maps, discuss travel, and explore different cultures.
- Watch geography-themed documentaries together – a recommendation is Planet Earth 3 on BBC.
- Talk about current events and their geographical implications.

Fun Geography Challenge



Ask your child:

Yr 7 - How do rivers change the landscape around us?

Yr 8 - What is the most effective way to protect the coastline? And why?

Yr 9 – Tell me about the structure of the rainforest. Why are plants able to survive in the tropical rainforest?

Yr 10 – Explain why there is a development gap in the world.

Yr 11 – Explain why rates of urbanisation are increasing around the world.


