Dear Parent/Carer,

We now have only 3 places remaining for the upcoming school tour to Valencia, Spain to support our curriculum plans for Spanish and enhance learning experiences within the school. Here are the key details about the planned trip:

- 3 days (2 nights) in Valencia.
- Departs on Monday 16th February 2026 (Precise details TBC)
- Returns on Wednesday 18th February 2026 (Precise details TBC)
- The cost is £695 per pupil payable by 5th December 2025

This price includes:

- Outbound & Return Flights (Manchester-Valencia)
- One item of checked in luggage
- Bed & Breakfast accommodation in a central location
- Airport transfers and assistance in both the UK and Spain
- Travel Insurance
- All trips and visits whilst in Valencia

This trip is being offered to all students. Places will be allocated on a first come, first served basis upon return of the expression of interest consent slip below. These should be given directly to Miss Jones in the MFL department. We will contact you to confirm that your child has successfully been allocated a place and with further details about payment.

The itinerary for the trip will include but is not limited to guided visits of Valencia Old Town and a town trail, a guided tour of Mestalla FC Valencia and Las Fallas Museum and a visit to the Valencia Science Museum & Oceanographic aquarium. There will be plenty of opportunities to take in the sights of Valencia and experience Spanish culture.

In addition to the tour cost, we recommend that your child has adequate spending money for the trip and enough to cover both lunch and snacks for 3 days (approximately £10 per meal, per day). They will also require a current and valid passport with at least 6 months remaining from the departure date. Please note that non-UK passport holders may also require an additional visa for entry into Spain.

Payment of £695 would be no later than 5^{th} December 2025. An initial deposit of £150 is required to secure a place once this has been confirmed and a payment schedule will be sent to you accordingly. Interim payments can be made at your discretion. All payments should be made directly via Parent Pay. This will be confirmed in writing for you with full instructions regarding payment once places have been allocated.

The trip is booked through PGL Group who work closely with us during the whole tour planning process to ensure that your child will get the very best learning experience whilst away. Curriculum Spotlight - History

Why study History?

History helps students understand the world they live in today by exploring the past. It develops critical thinking, empathy, and the ability to analyse evidence—skills that are valuable for further study, work, and everyday life.

What students are learning this half term



- Year 7 The Norman Conquest: How William took control of England in 1066.
- Year 8 Henry VIII and the Reformation: Henry's Break from Rome and the impact on Christianity in England.
- Year 9 The First World War: Causes of the War, Life in the trenches and how the war shaped modern Europe.
- Year 10 Medicine Through Time: Medieval and Renaissance Medicine.:
- Year 11 Superpower Relations and the Cold War: Tension between the USA and the Soviet Union.

Why this is important



Studying these topics helps students see how events in the past shaped society, politics, and culture today. For example, Year 8s work on the Reformation leads to discussions about the different religions in England today and how religious tension have been created over time.

How you can Support at Home



- Ensure your child completes their History homework Homework is set once a fortnight on Microsoft Teams, and
 is based on knowledge studied in current learning or previous learning, It is vital this is done to ensure students
 remember core information to be successful in assessments.
- Get them to revise the key information using their knowledge organisers and the 'Look, Cover, Write, Check' technique.
- Discuss what they have been learning with them and ask them questions showing this interest will help keep them engaged.
