Confirmation of end of term arrangements & first day back in September

As we approach the final two weeks of the academic year, I want to take a moment to thank you for your ongoing support of school. On the 23rd July we close for the academic year and below are the arrangements for the end of term and the return school dates in September.

A reminder that our uniform provider, Whittakers, will be in school on Sunday 3rd August 2025 between 11am until 2pm if you wish to call into school to purchase uniform.

Last Day of Term - Wednesday 23rd July

This will be the final day of school before we break up for the summer holidays.

Students are expected to arrive as usual for morning line-up at **8:25am** and will finish the day at **12pm**. Please ensure your child is in school on this day.

Measles Outbreak

Dear Families,

We have been asked by Salford City Council to advise you that there are ongoing measles outbreaks in several regions in England, including cases in Salford. The ongoing outbreaks have primarily affected unvaccinated children under 10 with some needing hospital care, especially the very young.

The Health Protection Agency are <u>warning that the upcoming summer travel season could trigger more cases</u>, as families visit countries and areas in the UK experiencing measles outbreaks. European cases are already double the number reported last year – the highest since 1997.

Parents are urged to check their children's vaccination records and ensure they've received both doses of the MMR vaccine, which is free on the NHS. It's never too late to catch up on missed vaccinations. Children should receive two MMR vaccinations, the first at 12 to 13 months old and the second, at 3 years and 4 months. By ensuring children are vaccinated on time will protect younger children who are not old enough to get vaccinated yet.

Dear Parents / Carers,

Before we break for the summer holidays parents and carers of Year 7 and 8 students will receive by email (and a copy of this email will also be available via the Arbor App) an invitation with a personal appointment to attend their child's Academic Review on either Thursday 23rd October or Thursday 6th November 2025.

Appointments have been made early to provide everyone with sufficient notice to ensure, where required, arrangements can be made to allow parents/carers to attend their child's Academic Review along with their son/daughter.

Academic Reviews have replaced our 'traditional' Parents Evening events that have been held in previous years for our Key Stage 3 students.

Each Key Stage 3 student has been allocated an Academic Mentor who will conduct the review. The review will last for 20 minutes. During the meeting there will be an opportunity to discuss the student's progress in all of their subjects as well as reviewing their involvement and contributions in all other aspects of school life. By the end of the meeting parents/carers will be provided with a summary of 'next steps' that can be used to help support the student in the next phase of their educational journey.


Summer Reports

Notification of the Report

A couple of weeks ago we looked at in-app messages. We will be using this method to inform you of the release of your child's report this summer.

As long as you've not turned off push notifications, you will get the notification. Once in the app, you can view your messages by tapping on the icon.





The message should look something like this:







Opening the Report


Unfortunately, the App doesn't let you just click on the message to take you to the report, so instead you'll need to go to the Report Cards section to find your report once you've received notification of its release.

You can get to these from the main menu by clicking on either of the two "Report Card" links



Here you can click onto the report then click on the link to download it and view it in the app.





The app also includes navigation tools to help you view these reports on your phone, such as the zoom buttons (highlighted in red) and the page buttons (highlighted in blue) to allow you to move through reports with multiple pages.




