#### **Mastery Sessions**

Dear Parent/Carer,

From next week, Students in Years 7-9 will be given knowledge organisers to use in preparation for Mastery sessions, which will launch in Half Term 2. Mastery sessions will take place weekly during form time in the Sports Hall. Students will be given a page of their knowledge organiser the week before to self-quiz at home using the 'Look, Cover, Write, Check' method.

To support your child at home, please ensure they complete their self-quizzing weekly using the correct 'Look, Cover, Write, Check' method, which is as follows:

Look- Students read the information assigned to them from one page of their knowledge organiser

**Cover** – Students will cover up the page of their knowledge organiser which contains the relevant information.

Write - Students answer a set of assigned questions, without looking at the information provided.

**Check** – Students go back to the original page of information and check how many answers they have answered correctly and make changes to those that were incorrect.

Form tutors will check this self-quizzing during form time to ensure students have completed it, and then a Mastery quiz will take place in the Sports Hall based on the self-quizzing students have done. If students commit to self-quizzing at home each week and participating fully in the Mastery sessions, it will have an impact on their school performance. The Educational Endowment Fund did some research into the benefits of student self-quizzing, and they found it can have up to a +0.87 impact on student outcomes, and those who regularly commit to self-quizzing at home perform 30% better on assessments than those who don't.

From **W/B 10<sup>th</sup> November**, Knowledge Organisers will become a compulsory part of school equipment for Year 7-9 students, and any students who do not bring their knowledge organiser on the Mastery Check Day, and their scheduled Mastery Day, will receive a Lowry Line. Any student that receives 2 Lowry Lines each week will receive an after-school detention that week.

We would like to thank you for your continued support in driving forward achievement at the Lowry Academy.

Parents/carers will receive a summary of 'next steps' to support their child's ongoing development.

#### Curriculum Spotlight - Maths

Studying maths is important because it teaches us how to think clearly, solve problems creatively, and see patterns in the world around us. Mathematics is more than numbers. It's a language of logic and discovery that builds confidence in reasoning and decision making. Whether designing technology, managing finances, or understanding nature, maths empowers us to turn curiosity into understanding and challenges into opportunities. We teach a broad curriculum so that all students have the opportunity to successfully build on their skills in whatever path they take after GCSEs.

#### What students are learning this half term



- Year 7: Numeracy skills, order of operations, introduction to algebra
- Year 8: Powers and roots, prime factorisation, rounding, fractions
- Year 9: Decimal manipulation, estimation, related calculations, HCF and LCM of large numbers, fraction calculations
- Year 10: solving equations, rearranging formulae, straight line graphs, simultaneous equations, volume
- Year 11: Year 11 teachers deliver a bespoke scheme of learning for each class to identify and address specific gaps in knowledge to best equip them in their formal examinations

#### Why this is important



Studying these topics gives students a broad range of mathematical skills which are transferable and allow students to apply logical thinking and reasoning to problems.

Numerical skills allow people to make basic life decisions, from money management to event planning, whilst algebra allows people to generalise ideas and use basic formulae.

Powers and roots are used in many different careers, such as engineering, medicine, finance and computer science. Rounding allows people to make estimations which can be used in everyday tasks such as shopping.

HCF and LCM is used by suppliers, in music composition, timetabling and well as many other logistics problems. Solving equations is used in everyday life without people even realising, but also trains the brain to think logically, identify patterns, and devise solutions, which is useful in all areas of life.

#### How you can Support at Home



- Ensure your child completes their Sparx homework on time every week. Sparx algorithm gets to know each student and adapts their tasks to make them bespoke and work on the topics they have knowledge gaps in. Homework is released to students every Friday at 4pm and is due Thursday 8am (Y11) or Friday 4pm (all other year groups).
- · Talk to your child about the importance of Maths to access the next steps after finishing school.
- The best way to improve in Maths is to do more Maths!

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Our culinary and nutrition teams are continually working hard to develop dishes and menus that are packed with nutrients, while providing choice and delivering on quality. As always, our menus will continue to provide children a choice of nutritious meals, while catering for those with allergies, and providing great value for money.

Over the last few years, we have maintained the prices for students in the canteen but like all UK businesses, we have been experiencing significant inflationary pressures. As has been widely reported in the media, these pressures have particularly impacted the price of food. We have been absorbing these costs through menu changes and negotiating with our suppliers.

To continue delivering a high-quality service that meets the School Food Standards, we will be freezing the meal price of £2.50 at your child's school but the cash tariff will see some changes increasing on some individual items from November 3<sup>rd</sup> 2025.

Our meal deal will remain at £2.50 ensuring all pupils can access a balanced meal deals which include a main meal and dessert, or a packed lunch deal with other offers available each day.

The new Autumn/Winter menu has been created in collaboration with the student leadership team feedback & they have played an integral part in the menu process.

All menus will continue to provide students a choice of nutritious and delicious meals, while complying with the Government's nutritional guidelines. We want to assure you that the decision to take this action was not taken lightly. We will always continue to do all that we can to provide you the best possible value for money.
