What is Geography?

This unit focuses on introducing the role of a geographer in today's world. The main purpose of the unit is to assess pupils' geographical capabilities related to the expectations of an 11-year-old; to provide a benchmark for the rest of Year 7. Pupils will develop a range of geographical skills throughout the unit.
